

### Points of Interest on this route



#### Bishop Tozer's Chapel

This interesting red brick building, with pantiled roof and distinctive round first floor window was built in 1867 at a cost of £320. The building originally combined a ground floor schoolroom with a place of worship above.

#### So Bracing!

In 1873, the arrival of the railway to Skegness brought with it an influx of holidaymakers. To advertise the increasingly popular destination, The Great Northern Railway produced a poster using John Hassall's timeless masterpiece of 'The Jolly Fisherman', which they bought in 1908 for twelve guineas, and added the now famous slogan 'Skegness is SO Bracing!'



#### Grandsire Bob

In 1629, as the fog blanketed the sea, Captain Frohock and his ship, the *Mary Rose*, searched in vain for Lincolnshire's coastline mindful that many made their living from wrecking ships. Sexton Guymer rang out a warning on Grandsire Bob, Burgh le Marsh's church tenor bell, in hope that lives would be saved.



1 From the Market Place in Burgh le Marsh, turn left and follow the pavement along the main road towards Skegness. As you leave the town, cross Ingoldmells Road onto the pavement which also now becomes a cycleway. After approx 100 yards you will come to a public footpath sign on your left. Ignore this sign and carry on another 100 yards to a second sign. Turn left, taking the public footpath along the driveway between two houses and follow the yellow waymark arrow.

2 At the field gate, cross over the stile, bear right and walk diagonally across the field to another stile in the top corner. Cross this stile, then follow the path alongside the field edge, over several stiles and footbridges for approx 2 miles to the Southview Leisure Park.

3 Cross the footbridge and turn left, with the new tree planting on your right. Continue ahead and after a few yards, at the last caravan, follow the edge of the banking parallel to the dyke to the next stile. Cross over the stile, turn sharp right and follow the hedge to the next footpath signpost. Turn left onto the tarmac road (between two caravans) to the next signpost partially obscured by leylandi conifer trees.

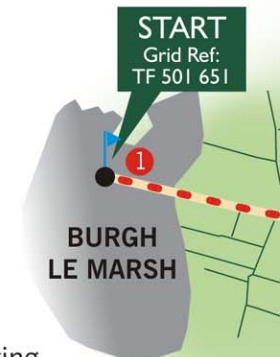
4 Turn right on to Beech Way. Follow this road to its junction with the main boulevard. Turn left here and then almost immediately turn right onto a path alongside the conifer hedge.

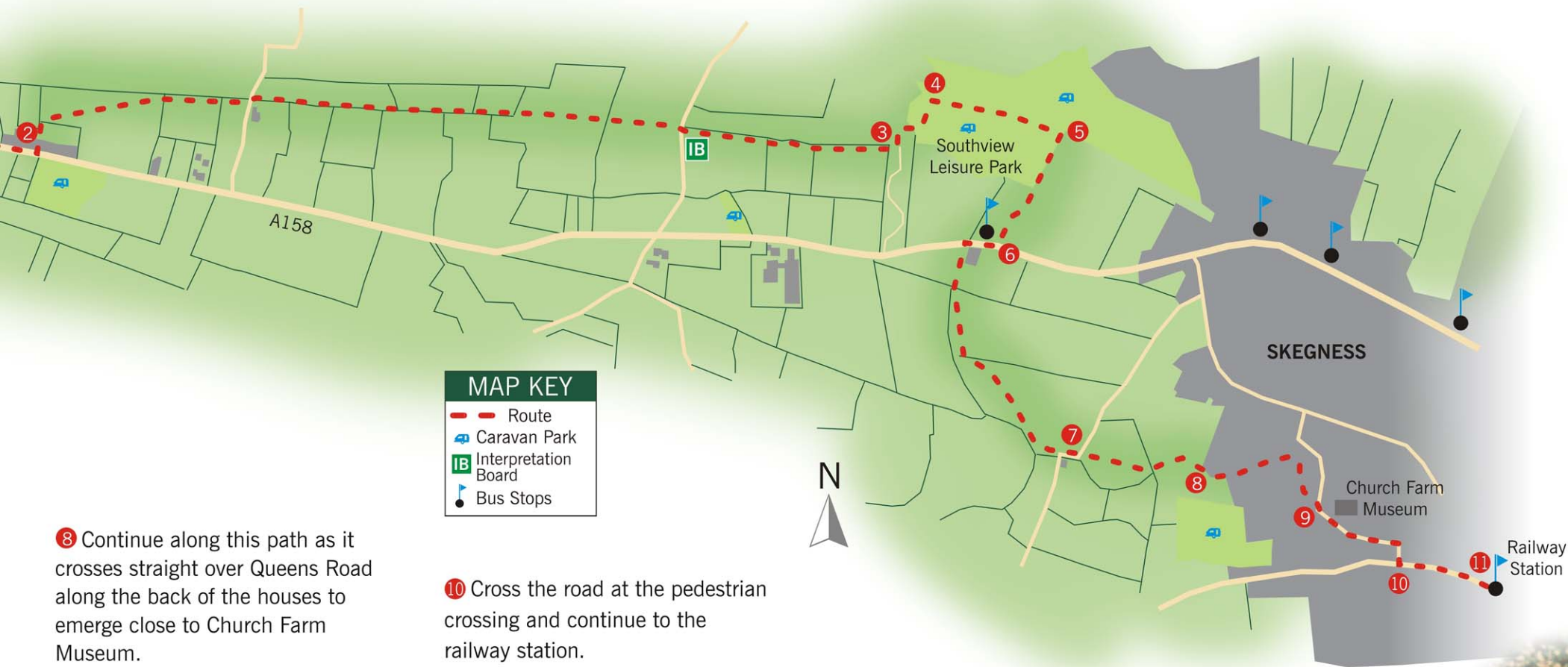
5 Follow this path which then bears right along the boundary of the caravan park to emerge at the main A158 road. (There is a bus stop outside Southview Leisure Park where you can catch the Interconnect 6 bus into Skegness).

6 Carefully cross straight over the main road, turn right and walk along the verge until you reach a footpath sign directing you alongside some derelict poultry sheds. Follow this clearly marked path, alongside a dyke, and diagonally across the next field, to emerge close to the pumping station at Warth Lane with Warth House across the road to your right.

7 Turn left and follow Warth Lane to the next bend and cross over the stile in the corner. Continue on this path bearing right to the top corner of the field. Cross the footbridge at the gap in the hedge and continue on the path at the back of the houses.

(Please take care here as the path narrows and there is a steep bank on your right).

**8** Continue along this path as it crosses straight over Queens Road along the back of the houses to emerge close to Church Farm Museum.

**9** Turn right and follow the road passing the supermarket on your left. At the road junction turn right, then left onto the main A52 Wainfleet Road.

**10** Cross the road at the pedestrian crossing and continue to the railway station.

**11** Enter the station and follow the signs to the adjacent bus station to pick up the bus back to the bus stop outside the Bell Inn at Burgh le Marsh.
