GRASS CUTTING



Skegness Town Council has taken over the responsibility to cut amenity grass verges in Skegness & Winthorpe. As a general rule if the grass is directly next to the road then Skegness Town Council is responsible for cutting that verge.

There are other grass areas in the Town that are not cut by the Town Council but by either East Lindsey District Council, Lincolnshire County Council or maybe even a local housing authority or power provider. If it is a larger area of grass or on the foreshore then it is not likely to be an area that we can cut.

We understand that as a local resident you just want the grass cut by “the Council” and that this can be very frustrating when you are being passed from authority to authority with each one saying, “it’s not us”. Please be assured that we are working with other authorities and residents to identify any areas that are not being cut and work out who is responsible for that area.

Please contact us to report an area of unsightly grass and we will do our best to advise and report to the correct authority. As this is the first year of taking over responsibility for cutting amenity verges it has highlighted some disputed areas of grass that we hope to have resolved as soon as possible.
